Who to call for advice and support when it is hot out:

- Call 2-1-1 for social services assistance information such as locations and to access information about day programs, meals, and how to access homeless shelters. Find out more about <u>shelters</u> in Ottawa.
- **Call 3-1-1** to get assistance for someone who needs transportation to a shelter to get out of the heat.
- Call 8-1-1 Health Connect Ontario for non-emergency medical advice.
- Call 9-1-1 for medical emergency such as heat stroke.
- Are you a parent? <u>Parenting in Ottawa</u> is the place to go!
- <u>City pools</u> convert to leisure swims, and all adult and specialty swims are cancelled. <u>City of Ottawa beaches</u> have multiple amenities and some of them are wheel-chair accessible.
- Are you an older adult? Do you live alone? <u>Seniors Without Walls</u> offers you the opportunity to connect with others and your community by conference call.
- The Distress Centre of Ottawa and Region provides <u>Wellness Check Services</u> They connect with patients who were recently discharged from hospital or who visited the emergency department for a mental health concern. **Note:** Patients are offered this service when they have visited a participating hospital for mental health reasons. (*This service does not accept public registrations, please speak* to your health care provider).
