FIELD INVESTIGATIONS

March 2021

Dear Resident,

The City of Ottawa will undertake subsurface utility, geotechnical and environmental investigations in your neighborhood. This work is being done to determine locations of existing buried infrastructure and soil conditions as part of the design phase of the Phase 3 Village of Richmond Forcemain Twinning Project.

What: The investigation work will involve the cutting of asphalt and hydro-excavating to expose existing buried infrastructure, drilling of boreholes, obtaining soil and water samples for testing to determine future construction methods and the locations for underground utilities. The investigations will be done by workers and equipment, as needed. Single lane closures at each work site will be required.

Why: This work supports the Village of Richmond Forcemain Twinning Phase 3 detailed design.

When: The field investigation work will commence in late March 2021 and could take up to eight weeks. Work will take place in off-peak hours to limit impacts to traffic.

Where: At localized spots along Eagleson Road between Hazeldean Road and Hope Side Road.

Who: Parsons Inc. and their sub-consultants, T2 Utility Engineers, Badger Daylighting and GEMTEC Consulting Engineers and Scientists, will coordinate the work for the City of Ottawa.

Accessibility
